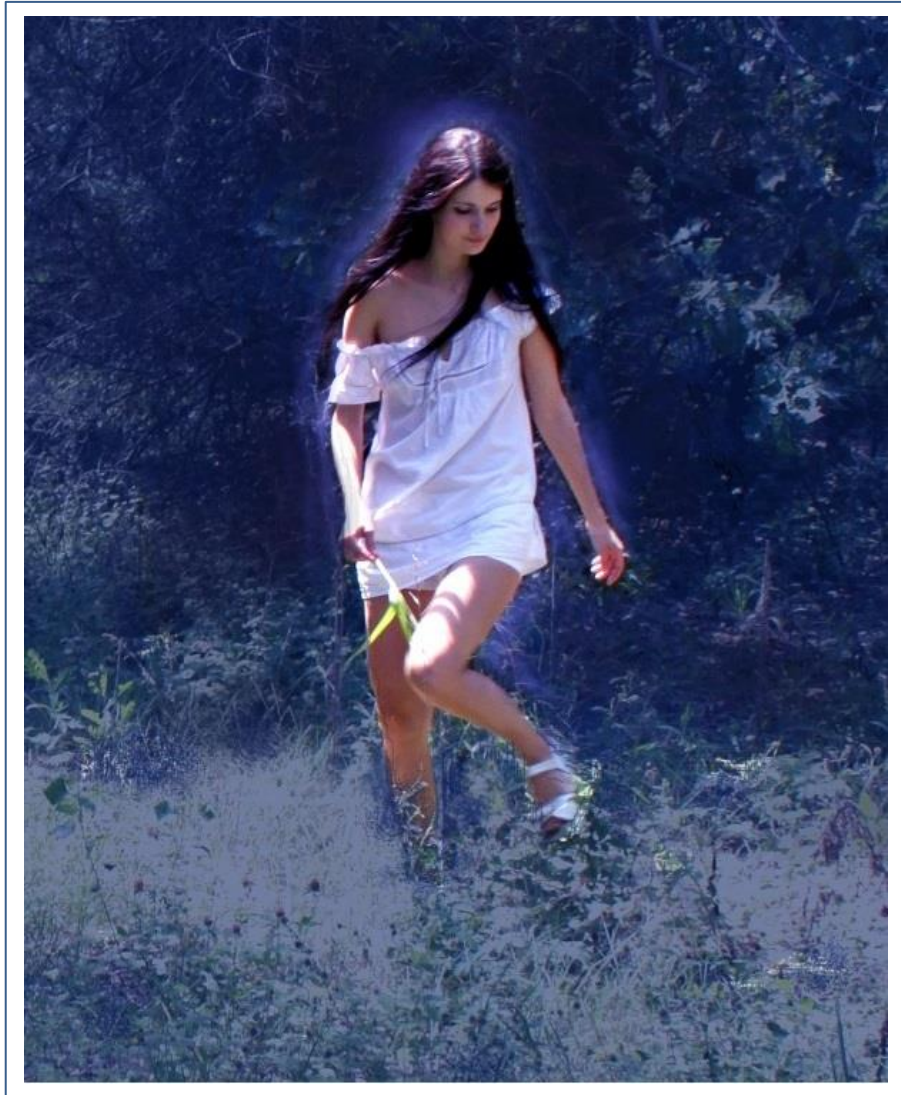


# POEMS
